


## WHAT ARE SEABIRDS? Birds adapted to life at sea



**WEBBED FEET** – Not all birds with webbed feet are seabirds, but all seabirds have webbed feet. They come in handy when swimming, diving, and chasing fish!




**COUNTERSHADING** – Seabirds, along with most other animals that live at sea, are dark on top and light underneath, providing camouflage from aerial and underwater predators.



**DULL COLORED PLUMAGE** – Grey and black pigments (melanins) provide structural support to feathers, making them more resistant to sun, surf, wind and salt.



**TUBE NOSE** – Many seabirds in Hawaii have nostrils enclosed in tubes, which allows them to smell their food from miles away across the ocean!
